

PRESS RELEASE

HONOLULU - On October 4, 2016, the Hawai'i Supreme Court issued an order allowing Honolulu attorney JEFFREY M. TAYLOR to resign from practicing law in lieu of discipline, effective November 3, 2016. In two matters, Mr. Taylor admitted to multiple ethical violations constituting misconduct sufficient to justify the Court in granting the petition. Mr. Taylor's misconduct included violation of the duties of competence, diligence, communication, and accounting for client funds.

The public is cautioned and advised that Mr. Taylor will no longer be licensed to practice law effective November 3, 2016, and until reinstated by order of the Supreme Court. Mr. Taylor cannot accept any new retainers, clients, or legal matters, and must also return to any existing clients their papers, property, and unearned advance fee payments.

Mr. Taylor, 68, was admitted to the Hawai'i bar on October 15, 1974.
