

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

1. Respondent Schum is suspended from the practice of law in the State of Hawai'i for 370 days, effective 30 days after the entry date of this order, as provided by RSCH Rule 2.3(a)(2) and RSCH Rule 2.16(c).

2. Respondent Schum shall, within 10 days after the effective date of his suspension, file with this court an affidavit that he has fully complied with the duties of an attorney suspended pursuant to RSCH Rule 2.16(d).

3. Respondent Schum's reinstatement in the State of Hawai'i is conditioned upon his completion of two credit hours of continuing legal education, seminars, or classes on ethics and discovery, pursuant to RSCH Rule 2.3(d)(ii).
